## Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

### Do You Know Your Story?

**St. Rose of Lima.** Born: 20 April 1586 Died 24 August 1617 at Lima, Peru  
Born to Spanish immigrants to the New World. A beautiful girl and devoted daughter,  
she was devoted to her vow of chastity ... Lived and meditated in a garden, raising  
vegetables and making embroidered items to sell to support her family and help the  
other poor. Dominican tertiary in 1606. Mystic. Visionary. Received invisible stigmata.  
Suffered from assorted physical and mental ailments. First saint born in the Americas.  
Founder of social work in Peru. Great devotion to Saint Catherine of Siena.

**St. Bartholomew the Apostle**

One of the Twelves Apostles. ... a close friend of Saint Philip; Bartholomew's name is  
always mentioned in the Gospels in connection with Philip, and it was Philip who  
brought Bartholomew to Jesus. May have written a gospel, now lost; it is mentioned in  
other writings of the time... preached in Asia Minor, Ethiopia, India and Armenia; ...  
Martyr was flayed alive for his witness to Jesus Christ.

**St. Monica,** Mother of St. Augustine.. Born 322 at Tagaste, Roman North Africa (modern  
Algeria), Died 387 at Ostia, Italy

Raised in a Christian family, she was given in marriage to a bad-tempered, adulterous  
pagan named Patricius. Mother of two, one of whom is Saint Augustine of Hippo whose  
writings about her are the primary source of our information about Monica. She prayed  
constantly for the conversion of her husband (who converted on his death bed), and of  
her son (who converted after a wild life). Spiritual student of Saint Ambrose of Milan.  
Reformed alcoholic.

### From the Catechism of the Catholic Church n. 966

"Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death."<sup>508</sup>  
The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians:

*In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the source of Life. You conceived the living God and, by your prayers, will deliver our souls from death.*<sup>509</sup>
